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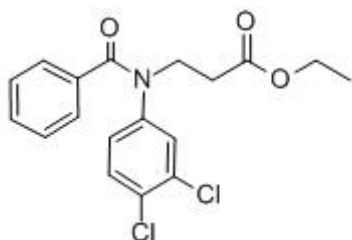

3. Hazards Identification

Inhalation: Toxic if inhaled. Material may be irritating to mucous membranes and upper



respiratory tract.

Skin: May cause skin irritation. May be harmful if absorbed through the skin.

Eyes: May cause eye irritation.

Ingestion: May be harmful if swallowed.

Hazards: Emits toxic fumes under fire conditions.

4. First Aid Measures

Skin: In case of skin contact, flush with copious amounts of water for at least 15 minutes.

Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Call a physician.

Eyes: In case of contact with eyes, flush with copious amounts of water for at least 15 minutes. Assure adequate flushing by separating the eyelids with fingers. Call a physician.

Ingestion: If swallowed, wash out mouth with water provided person is conscious. Call a physician immediately.

Inhalation: If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen.

5. Fire-Fighting Measures

Fire Fighting: Extinguish using Water spray. Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, or appropriate foam. Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and protective clothing to prevent contact with skin and eyes.

Fire Potential: Non-combustible, substance itself does not burn but may decompose upon heating to produce corrosive and/or toxic fumes.

6. Accidental Release Measures

Small spills/leaks: Sweep up, place in a bag and hold for waste disposal. Avoid raising dust.

Ventilate area and wash spill site after material pickup is complete.

7. Handling and Storage

Safe handling advice: avoid contact with skin and eyes. Do not breathe dust. When using do not eat, drink or smoke. Wash face and hands before eating, drinking or smoking.

Requirements for storage rooms: keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs.

Keep only in the original container in a cool, well ventilated place.

8. Exposure Controls/Personal Protection

Personal Protection: Compatible chemical-resistant gloves. Chemical safety goggles.

Respirators: Government approved respirator.

Exposure Effects: Properties of this material have not yet been prepared. Any recommendations are of a general nature. Many chemicals cause irritation of the eyes, skin, and respiratory tract. 11. Toxicological Information

Acute oral LD50 for mouse: 716 a.i.mg/kg.

Acute dermal LD50 for rat: >1000 a.i.mg/kg.

Effect on birds: high toxicity to birds, acute LD50 for duck is >200 a.i.mg/kg.

Effect on fish: moderate toxicity to fish, acute 96 hour LC50 for Bluegill sunfish is 0.494 a.i.mg/L.
